The Red Line (Linha Vermelha) was extended to Lisbon Airport in July 2012, this connects with Oriente Station (3 stops) for onward train routes to other towns and cities in Portugal and beyond. A single ticket costs 1.65 Euros per ride. A 1 day Carris/Metro pass valid on the buses and metro is 6.60.
