



The distance between energy storage projects and residents





Overview

In Section 15.5 of NFPA 855, we learn that individual ESS units shall be separated from each other by a minimum of three feet unless smaller separation distances are documented to be adequate and approved by the authority having jurisdiction (AHJ) based on large-scale fire testing.

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In 2019, New York passed the nation-leading Climate Leadership and Community Protection Act (Climate Act), which codified aggressive climate and energy goals, including the deployment of 1,500 MW of energy storage by 2025, and 3,000 MW by 2030. 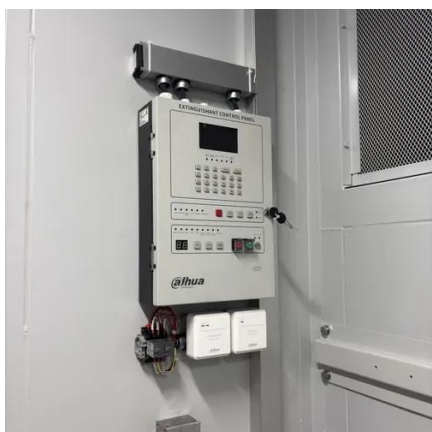
